## Customs

All major items brought into Croatia (e.g. laptops, boats) must be declared; doing so ensures that you will be allowed to take them back when you leave. Keep receipts for stuff you buy in Croatia and ask for a tax-free form for purchases over 500kn, you qualify for a tax refund when you get home. Ask for a stamp on the border. If you intend to buy works of art, ask for export approval before you buy. More on [www.carina.hr/engindex.htm](http://www.carina.hr/engindex.htm).

## Electricity

The electricity supply is 220W, 50hz, so visitors from the United States will need to use a transformer to run electrical appliances.

## Religion

These days Croatia is fairly monotone in religious terms. Having always existed on the frontiers of three religions; Catholic, Orthodox and Muslim; time was that one could find a right old mix here. However, since the most recent conflicts the population has become overwhelmingly Catholic with the 2001 Census recording 87.83% as loyal to Rome.

## Visas

Citizens from Australasia, EU, North and South America are allowed into Croatia without a visa. Everybody else needs a visa which must be obtained before entering the republic - you can't do this at any Croatian land border.

You are required by law to register with the police, a matter taken care of by hotels, hostels and campsites. If you're staying with friends you have a 24 hour period to complete some paperwork at the police station (tel. 92) - be sure to bring your passport! And no, the police won't hunt you down should you fail to register with them, it merely saves you a lot of headache if you should find yourself in trouble while you're in Croatia.

**Ethnic composition** (April 2001): 89.63% Croats, 4.54% Serbs, 5.83% other.

**Territory:** Croatia's land territory takes up 56,542km<sup>2</sup>. It shares borders with Hungary, Slovenia, Serbia & Montenegro, Bosnia-Herzegovina and a sea-border with Italy. The highest peak (1,831m) is in the Dinaric Mountains which create a natural border between Croatia and Bosnia-Herzegovina.

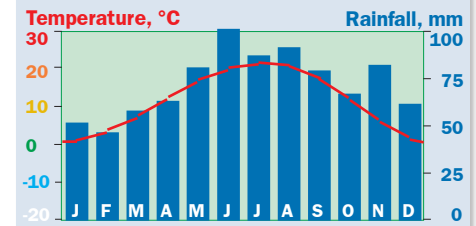
**Dalmatian coast:** The coast is the main tourist attraction for good reason - the crystal clear waters are some of the most beautiful on the planet and among its most pure!

**Islands:** An amazing 1,185 islands lie off the Dalmatian coast, 47 of them inhabited.

**Rivers:** The longest river is the Sava at 562km. It ambles just south of the train station. The Drava covers a distance of 505km; the mighty Danube spans 188km through the country.

**Local time:** Croatia is part of the Central European Time Zone (GMT+1); when it is noon in Zagreb it is 12:00 in Berlin, 11:00 in London, 06:00 in New York, 14:00 in Moscow, and 21:00 in Sydney.

## Tourist information

**Karlovac Tourist Board F-10, Petra Zrinskog 3, tel. 60 06 06, fax 60 06 02, karlovac-touristinfo@ka.t-com.hr, www.karlovac-touristinfo.hr.** ▶ Open 08:00 - 15:00, Sat 08:00 - 13:00. Closed Sun.

**By bus** Karlovac Bus Station (M-5) has far more facilities than the railway station. Abandon your bags in the **left luggage facilities, (Garderoba)**, for 5kn/day. There are two **cafés** in the station: Gostionica Albatros, open daily 05:00-22:00, Sun 06:00-22:00 and Bistro Duga, open daily 05:00-23:00. There is also a **shop** Dabar that is open daily 06:00-21:00, Sun 06:30-21:00. **Calling home:** Purchase a phone card at the news-stand or kiosk which is open 24 hours and use one of the public pay phones. The **toilets** cost a standard 3kn.

**Changing money:** There is an exchange bureau called Rakun (tel.61 47 32) open daily 08:00-12:00 and 16:00-19:00, Sat 08:00-13:00, Sun cls. **Getting to town:** The taxi rank is just outside the station and should you want to walk the 10 minutes into town, turn right from the station towards Kralj Tomislav Street which leads you to the well-known Karlovačka zvijezda (The Karlovac Star).

**Arriving from Zagreb by bus:** Leave from the Zagreb Bus Station (autobusni kolodvor) located in the Marin Držić Avenue bb. Prices are reasonable. A single ticket to Karlovac costs from 36-40kn and will take approximately 45 minutes. For more information visit the Zagreb Bus Station website: www.akz.hr

**Arriving from Zagreb by plane:** If you are arriving at Zagreb's Airport (Zračna luka Pleso), Croatia Airlines runs a bus service

from the airport to the Zagreb Bus Station. It costs 30kn and takes about 30min. Once you get to the bus station, take a bus to Karlovac.

**By car From Italy:** When coming from Trieste, look for signs 'Fiume' and route number E63 /local route7, which crosses Slovenia and enters Croatia at Pasjak or Rupe. Local road 8 leads you into Rjeka, where a motorway toll will cost you 5kn. After that follow the 107km long A6 motorway that runs directly from Rjeka to Karlovac. The motorway toll costs 40kn in one direction.

**From Slovenia:** After you cross the border at Rupe or Pasjak, local road 8 will take you directly to Rjeka and then follow the A6 motorway Rjeka-Karlovac. From Ljubljana follow the A2 motorway towards the Bregana border crossing and then join the A3 motorway into Zagreb. From Zagreb the A1 motorway / route number E65 drops you directly into Karlovac.

**From Zagreb:** The 42 km long A1 / E65 motorway runs directly from Zagreb to Karlovac. The motorway toll costs 16 kuna in one direction and is payable in most currencies.

**Road Safety**

The legal limit for drinking and driving is 0.0% blood alcohol concentration. The speed limit in urban areas is 50kph and 130kph on highways. Using a mobile during driving is strictly forbidden whilst fastening car belts is obligatory.

**By train** The facilities at the railway station (E-8) do require the odd touch up but are generally sound. It includes a **ticket office** which is open daily 05:00-21:00 and has a free public toilet.

**Getting to town:** Since there is no taxi rank outside the railway station, call one of these phone numbers: 098/853-845, 098/353-685 or simply stroll to the underground hallway that is in front of the station and under the main road which leads across Banja. Take a right turn towards center and walk across the bridge over the Kupa River. It will take you approximately 10 minutes to get to the city centre.

## Essential Karlovac

**Count Josip Jelačić Square (Trg bana Josipa Jelačića) P-2.** A sensation of solitude and serenity sweeps over you as you stand in the Baroque square, admiring the architecture of bygone years. Surrounding the square are former palaces of noblemen, artisans and merchant's houses, and the Holy Trinity church, all adapted to the urban plan of the star. On the square a votive column was erected in dedication to the Madonna to protect the city folk from further grief after the plague epidemic of 1691. In the centre of the square sits the well of 1869.

**Dubovac Castle (Stari grad Dubovac) C-9.** Its name originating from the oak forests of the area (Dub or Dab = Oak), the Old Town of Dubovac dates back to the 13th century. Dubovac Castle is only a short walk away from the centre of town (northwest from the star), just head for the highest hill your eye can see. Once you reach the top of the castle's prehistoric hill, you'll be rewarded with spectacular views of the city below and its long stretching Kupa River. The castle was built in the 13th century for the Gorič-Babonić counts and further expanded upon in the 15th century where the castle was rebuilt in Renaissance fashion. The former owners included the noble Slavonian Sudars (1387) and the Frankopans (1442). By the 16th century, it had passed into the hands of Stjepan Frankopan's sister Katarina as a wedding gift when she married the famous Croatian nobleman and warrior, Nikola Šubić Zrinski. Gašpar Šubić Peranski possessed the property in 1576 and in the later part of the 16th century Dubovac Castle was used as a granary as the developing town of Karlovac became an important trade centre. The keep, then entered by a small drawbridge, was used as a jail. From 1671 onwards until the arrival of the French in 1809, the old city was owned by the generals of Karlovac. In 1837 Earl Laval Nugent restored it in the spirit of Romanticism. It was later bought by the city of Dubovac in 1896. Perfectly located, the preserved castle and tower is remarkably charming...you almost expect to see figures from another era dashing about. Ticket costs 10kn adults, 5kn kids and is valid for visiting City Museum as well. In the period from 01 September till 31 March you need to call to arrange a visit on the number 61 59 80. ▶ Open 10:00 - 22:00.

**Josip Juraj Strossmayer Square (Trg Josipa Jurja Strossmayera) O-2.** This Baroque styled square of semi-circular shape lies in the north-western part of the star and dates back to the 18th century. The Baroque palace of the current city museum built earlier in the 17th century faces the square, other buildings include artisan's houses, military palaces and the town hall, with the town's government based here. An interesting structure sits in front of the city museum, the foundation remains from the 17th century of St Joseph's chapel.

**Karlovac City Museum (Gradski muzej Karlovac) O-2, Strossmayerov trg 7, tel. 61 59 80, fax 61 59 81, visnja.lasic@gmk.hr, www.mdc.hr/karlovac/hr.** Located on Strossmayer Square, the permanent exhibition pertains to the identity of Karlovac and is held in its oldest yet quite appealing town palace which dates to the 17th century Baroque period. The palace was built as a residence and headquarters by the Karlovac General Vurk Frankopan. The museum's entire collection boasts details from prehistoric artifacts to cultural exhibits, to 20th century ethnographic fashion, all appropriately related to Karlovac, its people and its experiences thus far. 10kn entry for adults, 5kn for kids. ▶ Open 07:00 - 15:00, Sat, Sun 10:00 - 12:00.

**Karlovac Star (Karlovačka zvijezda) F/G/H-9/10.** The most interesting feature of Karlovac is perhaps its most peculiar architectural point, its star formation, which

was designed around a typical Renaissance styled urban centre plan. Designed for purposes of defence in keeping out the troublesome Turks, this six-pointed star formed an interestingly different type of fortress, one based on ditches and a moat! Walls were built up on the foundations of the star, and in each of the six corners a strong bastion was erected. It's interesting to note that there are only two other towns in Europe that have similar plans (Palmanova in Italy and Novy Zamk in Slovakia). The beginning of the construction of Karlovac fortress is known as the birthday of Karlovac - 13th July 1579. The city was built upon a Zrinski family estate, beneath the Old Town of Dubovac. The city was situated inside the lines of the star, some sectors which are located within the star include, are the Holy Trinity church and its Franciscan monastery and the Orthodox, St Nicholas church (1784-86) which lie on the main square. On the same square one can see a well (1869) that is decorated with terracotta sculptures which symbolise the seasons. Old plans of the city portray geometrically lined streets and city blocks. The first residents were military men and their families followed by civilians. This new city was named after its founder Karlo von Habsburg, but for some time it was simply known as the new fort under Dubovac and then a century later when the city really developed its identity as, Karlovac beside Dubovac. The unique feature of this star is well worth the visit and is best explored by foot, so take a leisurely walk around the former bastioned fortress.

**Katzler House Pavillion (Paviljon Katzler) N-2, Radičeva bb, tel. 41 51 08 / 098 81 80 57, info@paviljon-katzler.hr, www.paviljon-katzler.hr.** This intriguingly distinctive building was built in 1891 to serve as an exhibition piece for the main exhibition fair in Zagreb. Several years later in 1897, the new owner becomes Wilhelm Friedrich Katzler, a gardner, and he begins to utilise this pavilion as a floristry, where it overflowed with flowers and plants that attracted the romantic passers-by. It also served as a gallery space for the well-known Croatian painter Oskar Herman (from the Munich circle). Recently restored, the pavilion still stands proudly, now housing a modest collection of antiques and memorabilia of Karlovac's past. Step inside to step back and glimpse into time. Souvenirs in photographs, postcards, paintings and memorial coins can be purchased here. It is open daily 10:00-13:00 and 16:00-19:00, Sat 09:00-13:00, Sun cls.

**The Franciscan Monastery and Church of the Holy Trinity (Franjevački samostan i crkva Presvetog Trojstva) P-2, Trg bana Josipa Jelačića 7, tel. 61 59 50.** Located on the main square, construction of this church began in 1580. The lay clergy led prayers until the arrival of the Franciscans in 1641. It was then that the General Vuk Frankopan pleaded with King Ferdinand III for authorisation to build a monastery, which was granted the following year, with construction beginning in 1658. Altars inside the church were dedicated to St George, St Anthony and St Nicholas. In 1683 General Josip Herberstein erected the church tower. In 1692 a fire greatly damaged the church and adjacent monastery, burning all altars and part of the tower with all renovation finally completed in 1705. In 1987 in a section of the monastery, Fr.Tomislav Tomiš placed a rich collection of sacrosanct art. Visiting is possible by arrangement to the number above.

Founded by the painter Josip Žunac, in a house over 200 years old, a collection is displayed of many facets of former village folk

life, some items mentioned back from the 15th century. This museum opened in 1995 and its history and character can be seen through the exhibition of the house itself, national costumes, handmade furniture, folk crafts and agricultural implements that give us insight into a former existence.

It also displays temporary and travelling exhibitions from the 19th-21st century in an open-spaced modern interior. ► Open 07:00 - 15:00, Sat, Sun 10:00 - 12:00.

**Our Lady of the Snows (Crkva Snježne Gospe) C-9, Dubovac, tel. 41 70 31, www.zupa-dubovac.com.** This parish church is situated in the old town of Dubovac, just a short stretch from the castle. Dedicated to Our Lady of the Snows, this church was built in the Baroque style from 1683-1732. In 1997 with donations from parishioners, especially those from Canadian St Joseph's society, the Way of the Cross (which includes 14 concrete chapels as Stations of the Cross) was constructed outside of the actual church, with the purpose of serving local followers and pilgrims. As the masses are held here only four times a year, for visit you should call the number above.

**Pauline Monastery Kamensko (Pavlini samostan u Kamenskom) Kamensko 53, Kamensko, tel. 64 18 00, fax 61 25 21.** This monastery, in honour of Virgin of the Snows, came into being by the generous donation of Katarina Zrinski in 1404, following the death of her husband Stjepan Frankopan. The Paulines came to the area in March 1404. Evidence has found an early gothic stage in the church and the monastery. Damaged by fire, on its 600th birthday the church received a restored wooden altar as the Baroque detailed 18th century altar had been damaged in the Homeland War of 1991. Dedicated to the Virgin Mary, it is said one of the most beautiful altars. ► Open . Closed Sun. Daily 08:00-12:00 and 16:00-18:00 except Sunday.

**The National Sanctuary of Saint Joseph (Nacionalno svetište svetog Josipa) C/D-9, Boškovića 36, tel./fax 41 70 31, www.zupa-dubovac.com.** Located right next to the Dubovac cemetery, this modern sanctuary was built in 1968 to accommodate the pilgrims who make their way from all over Croatia to celebrate the town's patron St Joseph. In 1969 a vestry was built and in 1970 a religious classroom. In 1987 it was declared a sanctuary by Croatian bishops. The academic sculptor Ante

Starčević created the main statues of St Joseph and the Virgin Mary. The most important pilgrimage here is 19th March, St Joseph's day. It will be open for you by arrangement.

**Miljokaz (Milestone)** . Located at the beginning of the historical Josefina Road that leads from Karlovac and on towards Senj, the statue Miljokaz is a symbol of the economical development of the town of Karlovac. The building of the road started in 1775 during the reign of Joseph II and was finished in 1779. It's final stop being the Great Gates of Senj. It was in this year that the city of Karlovac was declared a 'free royal town'. Miljokaz is placed on the exact spot that marks a 115 km distance between Karlovac and Senj and it also shows the distance between Karlovac and Rijeka which is written in the old German metric system. In 1892, another Karlovac landmark, Zorin Dom was built next to this monument as well as the beautiful promenade.

**Karlovac City Museum Strossmayerov trg 7, tel. 61 59 80, fax 61 59 81, www.mdc.hr/karlovac/hr.** Housed in the historic Vuk Frankopan palace on Strossmayer Square this revealing museum founded in 1904 holds a permanent collection with departments that cover natural science, archaeology, history, cultural history, ethnography with almost 18,000 holdings to keep you well informed about the heritage of the region.

A display of natural science and fossils is followed by an interesting archaeological exhibition of artefacts from the Karlovac region. These include items from the late Neolithic to the Medieval period. Particularly significant and remarkable is the largest such figurine collection in Croatia which contains the finds of almost 400 clay figurines from the Illyrian shrine at Turska kosa near Topusko. The Ethnographic collection boasts folk life and traditions with a focus on textile handiwork. The History Department collection leans towards the national identity with aspects of the social and political life prior to World War II also noting the period of the formation of Croatian independence. The historical and cultural development of Karlovac and its surrounding area in the period between the 14th century to the end of the 19th century is presented in thematically organised segments that provide a monograph treatment of the urban history of the town, the importance of trade and crafts and social and public life. The museum is available for guided visits with prior arrangement. Call in advance 61 59 80. ► Open 07:00 - 15:00, Sat, Sun 10:00 - 12:00.

**The Museum of Army Collections from the Croatian Homeland War (Muzej zbirke naoružanja iz Domovinskog rata) Turanj, muzejdomovinskograta@ka-net.net.** Located in Turanj, one of the most damaged areas of this region during the past war, and as a tribute to the recent Homeland War, this complete, large open-air museum is held in front of the old Austro-Hungary army barracks. The collection intended to educate the new generation of visitors and citizens contains several tanks, exhibits of war and of fighting technique, cannons and other elements of military battle.
